



## New OMIG Compliance Guidance **Are Your Compliance Programs Ready For New Reimbursement Systems?**

The New York State Office of the Medicaid Inspector General ([OMIG](#)) recently published a new [compliance alert](#) urging providers to consider the impact of new Medicaid reimbursement systems (such as value based payments) on their compliance program risk assessment processes. For example, OMIG said that providers' risk assessments may need to consider both "the integrity of the billing and payment process," and "the processes involved in the delivery of Medicaid reimbursable services."

OMIG reminded providers that they must have compliance programs that identify and combat any applicable compliance risks to them. Compliance programs must apply to a provider's "billings; payments; medical necessity and quality of care; governance; mandatory reporting; credentialing; and other risk areas that are or should with due diligence be identified by the provider."

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
